

The Beaver Moon Joins Saturn in the Constellation Aquarius

On the night of **November 10th**, a waxing-gibbous Beaver Moon “visits” the gas giant planet Saturn in constellation Aquarius, the Water Carrier. This year the Beaver Moon is “full” on the night of November 15th.

Joining the show below Saturn, in the faint constellation Piscis Austrinus, the Southern Fish, is the bright southern hemisphere star “Fomalhaut” – an Arabic name that means “mouth of the (southern) fish”.

Saturn, our planetary “lord of the rings”, is located some 856 million miles (77 light minutes) behind the Moon, and it’s in excellent position for telescopic observation of its spectacular ring system.
