

The Hunter's Moon Glides Past Antares

During the early evening hours on October 13-15, the waxing, crescent Hunter's Moon will glide past the bright star Antares in the zodiac constellation Scorpius, the Scorpion.

Antares is a red supergiant star that is intrinsically 65,000 times more luminous than our Sun, and it's located some 550 light years away.
